
Funded by the Appalachian Trail Conservancy in support of the Kittatinny Coalition

Kittatinny Ridge Blue Mountain First Rond North





- What would encourage you to spend more time recreating along the Ridge?






Survey Questions

- How important do you think the Kittatinny Ridge is as a source of clean drinking water?







- What else would you like to share about the Kittatinny Ridge that isn't covered by our survey questions or your responses?






